The Price of Peace

Dear partners in ministry,

When people think of African Enterprise, they mostly think of our work of evangelism. Or perhaps training programs or expressions of loving care and concern for the poor and disadvantaged through our practical self help projects. All these are true, but fundamentally African Enterprise has been a ministry of reconciliation, reconciling men and women to God through Jesus Christ through the proclamation of the gospel.

As the Apostle Paul reminds us in 2 Cor 5:18, "All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation". Our great concern is that those who have committed their lives to Christ become disciples of our Lord and then as close

personal followers make a difference in the world around them. A key part of this is for people to recognise that once they have been reconciled to God they also need to be reconciled to each other.

So important did we feel this ministry was, that we appointed a senior AE leader to head up our reconciliation ministry. Emmanuel Kopwe has been working behind the scenes in many places of ethnic conflict ever since.

The price of peace has not been cheaply won, and some AE members have paid the ultimate price for standing up for truth and justice. Emmanuel has carried on in that tradition, and has gone into some of the most dangerous areas you can imagine during periods of conflict.

Emmanuel has undertaken many trips into Burundi, a country with the same volatile ethnic mix as Rwanda, and in no small part has helped bring about a degree of stability, not only within political leadership, but also within parts of the church. People have experienced much trauma as a result of friends and family having been killed through ethnic violence. Often a spirit of unforgiveness exists, even within churches where there are different ethnic or political mixes.

"All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation." 2 Cor 5:18 The Burundi Leadership mission later this year, and next year our citywide mission to Bujumbura, the capital, are a testament to the ministry that is now able to be undertaken, because the fighting has stopped.

Across the border to the west, in the Democratic Republic of Congo, the country is trying to recover from a widespread war, which has killed an estimated four to five million people over the last eight years. Many observers believe this was the single biggest conflict on the planet since the end of the second world war in terms of loss of life, yet this has largely gone un-noticed by countries in the West because there was no direct involvement such as in Korea or Vietnam.

Here, too, Emmanuel has been working effectively, especially among political leadership to help try and avoid political divisions between the many factions spilling back into bloodshed.


For someone to say, "I looted and participated

in the destruction that happened, but now the Lord has changed my life and I want to tell everybody I am a different person," is a powerful testimony to the power of the gospel and the work of reconciliation to change lives.

The price of peace is high. Not only in terms of the dangers that are often faced by Emmanuel and his small team as they work tirelessly behind the scenes, but because the cost of ministry in these areas of conflict is expensive.

Emmanuel will shortly be visiting Australia and New Zealand, and I encourage you to take the opportunity of meeting him if you can. But please also encourage him by your support for the vital work that AE is carrying out across Africa. Please pray for him, for his safety and his health, and please give whatever gift you can as the Lord enables.

SERMON - NOTES FOR GROUP DISCUSSION

Bible passage John 16 v5-15 "Not what you know but who you know"

Talk together about people who have influenced your lives:

- What were they like?
- What did they do?
- How did they influence you?
- Why do you think they had that influence on you?
- Are there ways in which their influence on you has been passed on by you to others?

In our Bible passage today:

- What do we learn to encourage us in prayer?
- In what ways have you experienced the prayer and the joy that Jesus talks about hear how can you grow in these?

This is a very sad time with Jesus telling his disciples that He will soon be leaving them (see especially verses 32 & 33)

- What does Jesus promise them is going to happen when they face trouble in this world?
- In what ways have you experienced this promise of Jesus (that Has overcome the world so we can have peace)?
- One person makes this comment on Jesus teaching in verses 32 & 33, "The Christian joy and hope do not arise from ignoring the evil in the world, but from facing it at its worst. The light that shines for ever in the Church breaks out of the darkest pit of gloom"

Do you agree? How does this happen?

In John Chapters 15, 16 & 17 Jesus shows us a picture of God that Christians have always described as "The Trinity" – One God revealed as three Persons, God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit

- In John 15 & 16 how does Jesus teaching show us the Trinity?
- What do you find encouraging and what do you find confusing about relating to God as Trinity?

You could take time to pray for people and situations that you know

- where Christians are facing "trouble" in this world and pray that we will know the peace that Jesus promises and be assured that he has indeed overcome the world
- for us all that we may grow in our relationship with the true and living God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
