One of the challenges every church faces is to welcome the guest, the newcomer and the stranger in the name of Jesus. Many of us are encouraged by the warm welcome we receive from friends here at Shatin Church and we thank God for this!

How can we extend this kind of friendship to even more people, especially those who are newcomers? A few suggestions:

1 why not use “The Peace” to greet people you do not know and ask their name? Perhaps set aside one Sunday every month where you will avoid talking to your friends and try to minister encouragement with a warm greeting to someone you have not spoken to before. You could make a point of saying “hello” again at the end of the service and inviting them to join us for refreshments.

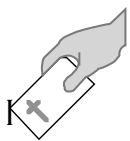

If you live on the 1/F of a village house, the escape ladder is for you!

The National Fire Protection Association of the USA recommends one ladder in every occupied room on floors above the main level. In case of fire, you may attach the escape ladder to a window and escape, as shown in the picture. This escape ladder is to be used only as a last emergency escape device.

This ladder was placed at 1/F of Maranatha House.

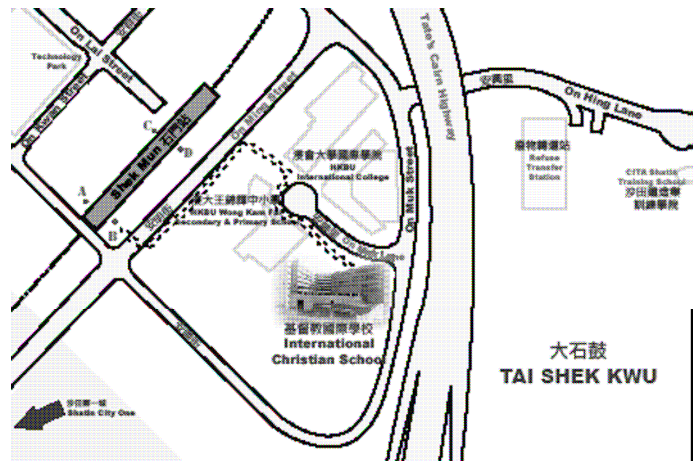

Dr. Darrel Falk
President, The BioLogos Foundation

Darrel Falk is a biology professor at Point Loma Nazarene University in San Diego, where he has taught since 1988. His courses include vertebrate physiology, comparative anatomy, microbiology, molecular biology, developmental biology, cell biology, general biology, general zoology, vertebrate biology, history and philosophy of biology and genetics.

Falk has also taught a Bible class in a Sunday school for senior adults for many years that has helped him

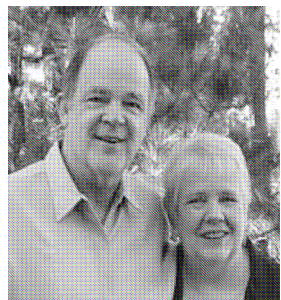
develop a deeper love for the integrity and truth of Scripture. For the past 15 years he has

also participated

in a weekly theology and science interdisciplinary discussion group at Point Loma University.

Falk's early research focused on *Drosophila* molecular and developmental genetics with funding from the National Institutes of Health and the National Science Foundation. He earned a doctorate from the University of Alberta and did postdoctoral work at The University of British Columbia and the University of California, Irvine before accepting a faculty position at Syracuse University in New York. Desiring to focus on undergraduate teaching in a Christian college setting and to think about biology more broadly than from a research perspective, he transitioned into Christian higher education 25 years ago.

Falk has given talks about the relationship between science and faith at many universities and seminaries in the last several years. Falk is a member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the Genetics Society of America and the American Scientific Affiliation. He is the author of *Coming to Peace with Science: Bridging the Worlds Between Faith and Biology*.



Dr. Jerry Layton
Missionary Founder: Creation Science Campus Evangelism

Jerry and his wife Donna recognize God's providential guiding hand specifically preparing and equipping them to pioneer this unique ministry directly evangelizing school systems of Asia. Since 1999, their openly evangelistic 2-hour symposium entitled "Creation Science – The Alternative to Evolution", endorsed by the Institute for Creation Research (icr.org), has been presented to well over 100,000 students and their teachers in hundreds of public schools and universities throughout the Philippines as well as Thailand and

Bangladesh, resulting in a rich harvest of new believers who are then followed up by

cooperating local

churches. Filipino director Victor DePaz continues to train and organize a growing army of local-church-supported Creation Science Evangelists. Their soul-winning effectiveness results from clearly presenting Genesis foundations of true science and history as a welcomed faith-building alternative to evolution.

Jerry & Donna met and were married in the Philippines in the 60's, serving in a science teacher-training program of the U.S. Peace Corps. After they returned to science teaching in the States, a 12-year-old Christian girl who often witnessed boldly in Jerry's 7th grade class surprised him with a friendly challenge: "Mr. Layton, you don't HAVE to believe in Evolution!" She was also ready with a Creation Science book by PhD scientist Duane T. Gish, *Evolution: The Fossils Say NO!* He took it and read it cover-to-cover that

very night. That book was the "missing link" God used, in answer to the prayers of that young girl's church, to release Jerry from the spiritual blindness of his evolution worldview, and opened his eyes to the Gospel (Acts 26:18)! Suddenly he recognized and confessed Jesus Christ as Creator and Lord, who then became his Savior! Within months of being saved and finding a Bible-teaching church, they were attending seminary in preparation for God's clear call to missionary service.

They returned to the Philippines in 1982, this time not with the Peace Corps but in the service of the Prince of Peace! They served in church planting, but took every opportunity to present his Creation Science Symposium whenever universities invited him. In 1998 a university biology department head prayed in closing "that Rev. Layton would return to help put God back into the science curriculum." God answered that prayer when they started full time the following year.

The Laytons are the parents of 4 happily married children who grew up in the Philippines but now live in the States, with their ever-increasing tribe of grandchildren. They travel anywhere from their activeretirement home near the church pastored by their eldest son.



Speakers:

Dr. Hugh Ross

President and Founder, Reasons to Believe

HUGH ROSS launched his career at age seven when he went to the library to find out why stars are hot. Physics and astronomy captured his curiosity and never let go. At age seventeen he became the youngest person ever to serve as director of observations for Vancouver's Royal Astronomical Society. With the help of a provincial scholarship and a National Research Council of Canada fellowship, he completed his undergraduate degree in physics at the University of British Columbia and graduate degrees in astronomy at the University of Toronto. The NRC also sent him to the United States for postdoctoral studies. At Caltech he researched quasi-stellar objects, or "quasars," some of the most distant and ancient objects in the universe.

Not all of Hugh's discoveries involved astrophysics. Prompted by curiosity, he studied the world's religions and "holy books" and found only one book that proved scientifically and historically accurate: the Bible. Hugh started at religious "ground zero" and through scientific and historical reality-testing became convinced that the Bible is truly the Word of God! When he went on to describe for others his journey to faith in Jesus Christ, he was surprised to discover how many people believed or disbelieved without checking evidence.

Hugh's unshakable confidence that God's revelations in Scripture and nature do not, will not, and cannot contradict became his unique message. Wholeheartedly encouraged by family and friends, communicating that message as broadly and clearly as possible became his mission. Thus, in 1986, he founded science-faith think tank Reasons To Believe (RTB). He and his colleagues at RTB keep tabs on the frontiers of research to share with scientists and nonscientists alike the thrilling news of what's being discovered and how it connects with biblical theology. In this realm, he has written many books, including: *The Fingerprint of God*, *The Creator and the Cosmos*, *Beyond the Cosmos*, *The Genesis Question*, *A Matter of Days*, *Creation As Science*, *Why the Universe Is the Way It Is*, and *More Than a Theory*.

Because he treats people's questions and comments with respect, he is in great demand as a speaker and as a talk-radio and television guest.
