

- 2. Receive Reports concerning the life of the Church. Reports are due in by Monday 7th February please.

3. Discuss any Motions, which have been presented to the Pastor in writing at least 2 weeks before the Annual Meeting.



PRAYERS FOR THE 2ND SUNDAY BEFORE LENT

Almighty God, give us reverence for all creation and respect for every person, that we may mirror your likeness in Jesus Christ our Lord.

We pray our annual church meeting today; we give thanks for those who have served on our church committee over the last year and pray for God's guidance on the newly elected members of the committee.

We thank God that He has answered our prayers for a pastor to succeed Dale and we pray for the life and ministry of this church to prosper through the time of transition until the new pastor arrives in the summer.

We thank God for his financial provision over the last year through the generosity of His people in Shatin church – may the gifts given be used wisely.

We pray for all those caught up in the unrest in North Africa and the Middle East.

We pray particularly for the weak and vulnerable, the poor and needy who always suffer the most in times of trouble; we pray particularly for Christians caught up in political, ethnic or religious strife.

As we see the scenes of violence in the media we remember Paul's command to pray for "social stability and spiritual freedom":

[1 Timothy chapter 2 verse1] I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone— 2 for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. 3 This is good, and pleases God our Saviour, 4 who wants all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth.

We pray for the victims of the earthquake in the New Zealand city of Christchurch.

We pray for those who mourn the loss of loved ones and pray for those seeking to bring relief to those who are suffering; we remember all those around the world who suffer the effects of "natural disasters":

[Romans 8 verse19] The creation waits in eager expectation for the sons of God to be revealed. 20 For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope 21 that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the glorious freedom of the children of God.

NOTES FOR OUR SERMON TODAY – EPHESIANS 5 VERSES 15 TO CHAPTER 6 V 9 "LIFE WORTH LIVING – NEAREST AND DEAREST"

5:15 Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is. 18 Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit. 19 Speak to one another with psalms, hymns and spiritual songs. Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, 20 always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

5:21 Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ.

5:22 Wives, submit to your husbands as to the Lord. 23 For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. 24 Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything.

5:25 Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her 26 to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, 27 and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless. 28 In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. 29 After all, no one ever hated his own body, but he feeds and cares for it, just as Christ does the church— 30 for we are members of his body. 31 "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh." 32 This is a profound mystery—but I am talking about Christ and the church. 33 However, each one of you also must love his wife as he loves himself, and the wife must respect her husband.

6:1 Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 2 "Honor your father and mother" —which is the first commandment with a promise— 3 "that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth."

6:4 Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.

6:5 Slaves, obey your earthly masters with respect and fear, and with sincerity of heart, just as you would obey Christ. 6 Obey them not only to win their favor when their eye is on you, but like slaves of Christ, doing the will of God from your heart. 7 Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not men, 8 because you know that the Lord will reward everyone for whatever good he does, whether he is slave or free.

6:9 And masters, treat your slaves in the same way. Do not threaten them, since you know that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and there is no favouritism with him.


