Get to Know our Ministries

Tea & Tots (Toddlers Playgroup)



This month we're getting to know the Tea & Tots ministry that meets on Fridays over a 12-week term at the church centre in Shek Mun.

Could you tell us a bit about how Tea & Tots got started and its purpose.

Tea & Tots started a little over a year ago, around September 2016, and it primarily ministers to parents and their children from 0-3 years old. Often, stay-at-home mums tend to get lonely and fall out of discipline in their lives. Many people may not realize that taking care of young children is very stressful. That's why this ministry is so helpful. It provides a regular, consistent meeting to look forward to each week where both dads and mums can find much needed mutual understanding, support and advice from fellow parents on parenting, going back to work, caring for a newborn, etc.

What does a typical day at Tea & Tots look like?

The ministry is growing! In September 2017, we expanded to two sessions: one at 9:00am and a second at 11:00am. For volunteers, the day starts around 8:20 am to set up and prepare for the first session. As families arrive, we greet them with tea

or coffee, and chat with them to get to know them better. As they settle in, children and parents have about an hour of playtime and snacks. Afterwards, Gillian and Pauline lead a short Bible story and sing-a-long. At the end of the session, we clean up the toys and say goodbye to the families as they leave.

What do you love about this ministry, and what draws you back week after week?

Rita: I joined the ministry when Rachel asked me to help serve tea and coffee to parents. Despite not having children myself and no prior experience with children, I found myself really enjoying serving with Tea & Tots. After a while, the children would start approaching me to play with them! For me, it's not the same routine each week because the children grow and change so quickly. Their reactions and moods are different from week to week.

Rachel: I cannot not come because after a long week, the kids cheer me up. It's exciting to witness them change, and if you miss a week or they skip a week, you really notice the difference. Another thing that's special about Tea & Tots is how it draws in newcomers, and has outreach potential. The newcomers find out about Tea & Tots through our church website, and just walk-in. Although some of them are not church-goers, they still enjoy coming. One couple, after a year at Tea & Tots, started to attend Shatin Church and their child now attends Kingdom Kids which is exciting to witness.

How can we pray for this ministry?

- More volunteers! Rita will step down at the beginning of 2018 due to work. No prior experience or special skills needed. You only need a heart to serve and greet people.
- Safety for everyone during the sessions.
- Wisdom for Christian parents and volunteers on sharing the good news with newcomers.
- Parents to build relationships and support one another.
- Families to know Christian family love.

Please tell us a bit about your family.
