

But through this God has grown us and deepened our faith; forcing us to depend on Him in each moment in ways we never had and holding fast of the hope we have because of what Jesus has done.

What do you look forward to in this next stage? What might be some of the challenges?

Rhys is looking forward to a new challenge and getting to know the youth and students at our new church in Lausanne. He will be working full time again so that will be an adjustment for us all, but it means Keturah can stay home and spend much more time and energy being a Mum! Additionally, we are looking forward to fresh air; hopefully a slightly slower pace of life and being nearer to our families. Joshua cannot wait to build a snowman. We are all excited to meet 'baby sister' too.

Moving to a whole new country itself is going to be a challenge and we know we will miss our HK friends very much. In terms of ministry, Switzerland is more secular compared to HK, which will be challenging and we will all need to learn French.

How can we pray for you?

Please pray for all the logistics involved in packing up here and setting up in Switzerland; pray for the right healthcare for Micah; for a smooth delivery of the baby; and for us all to make new friends. Get to Know our Mission Partners

How have things been going this past year?

2018 was a challenging year, both personally and in ministry. But I saw God's faithfulness mainly through the friends He provided to be there at times when I needed. When I injured my knee playing sports last February, friends were there to help me up and bring me home. When I needed to get away from the busyness of city life, He provided a new friend to go exploring with and find refreshment in the outdoors. And when I got asked to staff a Bible course run by YWAM Perth, He gave me the wisdom I needed to disciple the students. He brought leaders and friends

alongside to counsel and guide me where I needed help. Throughout this last year, God showed me what He is like in very practical ways through those people around me who have lived out what it means to look like Jesus.

What sorts of trends are you seeing among the youth you disciple?

I don't know all the challenges and struggles facing young people today, but one issue I have seen is a lack of worth or value stemming from a lack of quality time with significant people in their lives, especially authority figures. Too few authority figures use their influence to speak worth, value and life into children. These children then grow up believing they are not worth the time, not worth the effort, not worth much, if anything. This presents a challenge for ministry, because it means we need to spend quality time with them to show them that they are valuable and worth it. And that can be difficult when we are doing something, such as a short-term outreach overseas or in a different part of the state. For that, we rely on the local church and youth workers who are constantly there, and we try to partner with them whenever

possible to serve and strengthen what they are already doing.

What are your projects or goals (personal and/or ministry) for 2019?

I will undergo surgery for my knee this Feb 6, and the recovery process can take up to 6-9 months. That makes planning certain ministry goals challenging, as I'm not sure yet what I will or will not be able to do while I recover. Certainly office work should be manageable. But running a NIKO camp, for example, would be something I could only do after I've fully recovered. I do hope that by October, I should be well enough to run NIKO again, as I was not able to do so last year. But we shall have to see what the doctor says. In the meantime, I will be praying and processing with my leaders as to what I can do ministry-wise after the surgery.

How can we pray for/support you?

Prayer for the surgery and recover process would be very much appreciated. My surgery comes under the Australian healthcare system, which I qualify for because I am a New Zealand citizen. So I think I should be covered financially for this. But I would very much appreciate prayers for the process and recovery afterwards, and also for wisdom as to what ministry looks like this coming year in light of all that.

Come pray for Misha at our prayer meeting on 1 February. Like last month, we will start with praise & prayer at **7:30pm**, then have a meal together afterwards at 8:30pm.
